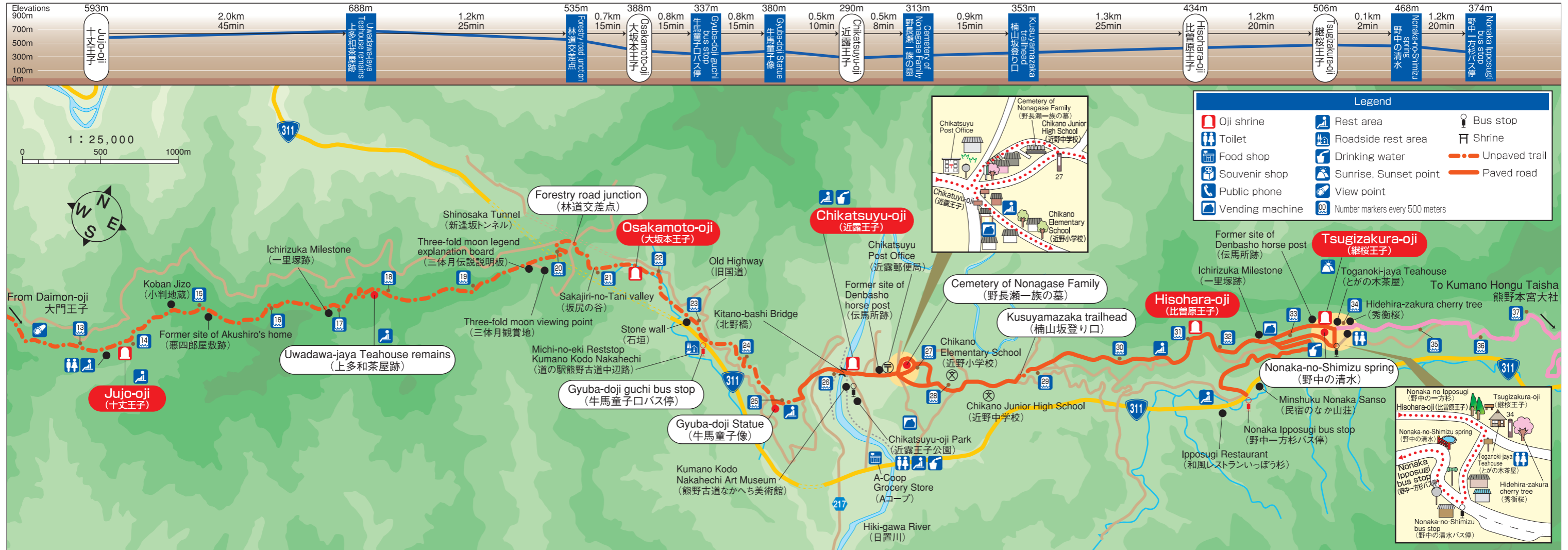


# Takijiri-oji~Tsugizakura-oji (Map2)

## (滝尻王子~継桜王子 その2)

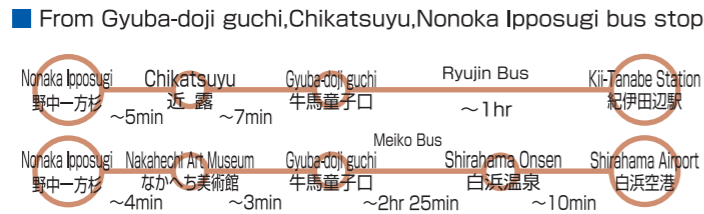
Walking Distance : 18.2km

### Return Transport

5 to 6 buses daily (Ryujin Bus) return to Kii-Tanabe station from all of the bus stops along highway 311.  
 2 buses daily (Meiko Bus) return to Shirahama.



### Lodging

There are Minshukus located near Chikatsuyu-oji, Tsugizakura-oji, and on highway 311 by Nonaka Ipposugi bus stop. Future lodging is also being planned for Takahara. This area is a great place to enjoy the quiet, relaxing atmosphere of Japan's countryside.
